Fall Frenzy “Strutt the Rutt” Buck Show

Show Rules:

1. This is a sanctioned show with the American Dairy Goat Association (ADGA). As such, ADGA rules shall govern.
2. The following breeds will be separately sanctioned for each show: Nigerian Dwarf, Nubian, Sable, Lamancha, Toggenburg, and Saanen. All other purebred (AOP) will include the following breeds: Alpine, Oberhasli, and Guernsey.
3. Early show entries will be \$8 per head per ring if you enter one to five rings and \$7 per head per ring if you enter all six rings. Late show entries will be \$11 per head per ring regardless of rings entered.
4. Early show entries are to be postmarked by Saturday, October 17, 2026 or entered in the Showman App by 11:59PM on Tuesday, October 20, 2026. Late show entries will begin at 12:00AM on Wednesday, October 21, 2026 and will continue through 11:59PM on Friday, October 23, 2026. All animals must be registered by these deadlines; there will be no entries allowed starting at 12:00AM on Saturday, October 24, 2026. An exception to this rule will be if an exhibitor was asked to bring extra animals to make sanction of a specific breed by a member of the show committee.
5. Entries may be mailed with a check or money order to the Southwest Missouri Dairy Goat Association, attention Donna Corkle, 14120 Buttermilk Lane, Carthage, Missouri 64836 or entered into the Showman App. Entries made via the Showman App may either be paid with a credit card through the Showman App or by PayPal. Your registration is not considered accepted until your payment has been posted.
6. There will be **no** emailed, phone call, or text entries accepted. All entries must either be mailed or entered into the Showman App to avoid confusion or missed entries.
7. Pens will cost \$10 each and will be assigned on a first come, first served basis. Pens will be assigned and marked with the exhibitor's last name. Exhibitors will be assigned the number of pens that they requested and paid for on the registration form. Exhibitors may show off of a trailer, but be warned; announcements are hard to hear outside of the barns.
8. Exhibitors may arrive anytime after 10:00AM on Friday, October 23, 2026 until 8:00AM on Saturday, October 24, 2026. All exhibitors will check in at the main building on the fairgrounds.
9. Check in will be open from 2:00PM to 10:00PM on Friday, October 23, 2026 and from 7:00AM to 8:00AM on Saturday, October 24. All exhibitors **MUST** either be checked in or in line by 8:00AM unless a late approval has been granted.
10. All animals **MUST** be at the Newton County A & M Fairgrounds either in a pen or on a trailer by 8:00AM on Saturday, October 24, 2026 unless Casey Starnes or Donna Corkle have approved a late arrival. For exhibitors showing only on Sunday, October 25, they may request a late arrival to arrive Saturday evening or early Sunday morning.
11. All animals will be inspected throughout the weekend for health issues by the show committee or one of their representatives. This includes all animals; whether in the barn or on a trailer. Any animals deemed unhealthy will be required to be removed from the fairgrounds immediately.
12. All animals entering the State of Missouri from another state must be listed and all information correct on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within 30 days of the show by a licensed veterinarian. This **MUST** be present at registration time; a copy will be made and retained for the show's records. No refunds will be given and animals will not be permitted to show if this form is not presented.
13. All animals within the State of Missouri must be listed and all information correct on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within 30 days of the show by a licensed veterinarian. This **MUST** be present at registration time; a copy will be made and retained for the show's records. No refunds will be given and animals will not be permitted to show if this form is not presented.
14. An original ADGA registration or recordation paper must be present at time of registration. **No photocopies will be accepted!** Animals may be shown on a stamped duplicate if papers have not been received by the show and it has **not expired**. Stamped duplicates are good only for 90 days following submission.
15. The base date for calculating age will be October 24, 2026 for the Saturday shows and Sunday, October 25, 2026 for the Sunday shows.
16. Best of breed winners for each show are required to stay for the best in show lineup.

17. Make sure to have multiple handlers available if you are showing multiple breeds. The show will keep moving.
18. Wash racks will be available. Please leave them clean.
19. Camping will be permitted at the fairgrounds.
 - a. For tent/canopy/cot sleepers, you may set up in the main building or any unused outside area of the fairgrounds.
 - i. For those exhibitors wishing to sleep in the main building, please keep the following in mind. The building you are staying in is a community building used by many different people for a variety of different things. It is asked that everyone keeps the noise level down at all times, but it is not guaranteed to be quiet at all times (including at night). If you are sensitive to noise, please consider purchasing ear plugs or considering other accommodations.
 - b. For campers/RV's/trailers who would like utility hookups, you may set up in the campground. The campground is equipped with electrical hookups. There are hydrants available for water in the general area, but not at every site. There is a fee of \$35 per night to stay in the campground. If you park in the campground, you must pay the fee. Upon paying the fee, you will receive a colored card that you must display on your vehicle on the side that faces the road. Display of this sign is mandatory as the show committee will be checking the campground throughout the weekend for unauthorized vehicles.
 - c. For campers/RV's/trailers that do not wish to stay in the campground, you may park in an open area on the fairgrounds. You **may not** run any type of electrical cord or water hose to any outlet on the fairgrounds.
20. All extension cords, fan cords, etc. must not be zip tied, tied with string, wire, etc, or in any way affixed to the metal pens. This is a safety issue for both the animals and humans due to the risk of the pens becoming electrified if the cord becomes physically damaged.
21. Any gas or propane fueled appliances, such as grills, camp stoves or heaters, must be used a minimum of 10 feet away from any building.
22. Showers will be available for all exhibitors. These showers are single gender showers; there are to be **ABSOLUTELY NO** members of the opposite gender in the showerhouse at any time. Failure to abide by this rule is a serious violation of show rules and will be dealt with by the SMDGA Executive Committee.
23. Exhibitors are suggested to dress in traditional whites, but it is not required.
24. Dogs are allowed on a 6 foot or shorter leash. They are **not** allowed in the show arena or in the show arena access chutes at any time. They must be attended at all times. Any dogs that exhibit aggressive behavior will need to be immediately removed from the fairgrounds.
25. There is to be no smoking/vaping in any of the barns, show arena, restroom buildings, or the main building. Smoking/vaping is permitted outside of these areas.
26. The Newton County A & M Board, the Southwest Missouri Dairy Goat Association, the Show Committee, and all of their representatives and members, shall be held harmless from any liability from your participation in this show. This includes any and all illnesses, injuries, or death that your animals, yourself, or a member of your party might incur during participation in the show.
27. Any person that is caught being disrespectful, rude, making false claims, or being physically or verbally abusive toward another exhibitor, judge, or committee member, will be immediately asked to leave the fairgrounds. If the person chooses not to leave when asked, security will be notified, and the person in question will be escorted from the grounds. There will be no refunds issued for any animals or services not yet rendered. This show has zero tolerance for this type of behavior.
28. The show rules, class list, show order, or schedule may be modified or added to by a member of the show committee to make the show run more efficiently.

29. The following table displays a **PRELIMINARY SHOW ORDER** for each ring. This order is **SUBJECT TO CHANGE** by a member of the show committee to make the show run more efficiently. Please refer to show order flyers posted around the show arena on show day for an up to date show order.
